- •Two weeks prior to the start date for all other programs.

### What To Expect

While we are excited to host in-person summer camps and programs again this year, our spaces are still limited. To help expedite the registration process, please review the registration information section on the website to see what information is needed at the time of registration.

### Online Registration

Online registration will open for Zoo members on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, at 10 a.m., and for the general public on Wednesday, March 27, 2024, at 1 p.m. Credit card payment is required for online registration. Zoo gift cards, coupons and checks are not accepted for online registration. Please visit **stlzoo.org** for detailed information on how to register online.

#### NOTE:

- •Online registration only.
- Fax, email and phone registrations are not accepted.
- Participants must be the appropriate age or grade level to attend the program.
- Participants can only register for one session of each program topic. Processing fees will apply for duplicate registrations, cancellations and/or transfers.

### Who Can I Register?

- Yourself
- Immediate family members residing in the same household (spouse and children)
- Grandchildren (as general public registration or as part of your membership if you have a Family/ Grandparent membership level or above).

#### **NOTE:**

Zoo members are not eligible to use their early registration and discount to register extended family members, friends, neighbors, out-of-town guests, etc.

These individuals must register themselves and their household members separately.

We reserve the right to cancel programs due to low enrollment or extenuating circumstances. Full refunds will be issued.

# New for 2024!

### **Queueing Software**

Due to high program demand, we will utilize queueing software to help manage high volume online registration. The goal is to reduce customer wait times and increase the number of customers served.

- •Once you have entered the queue, do not refresh your browser, or you will lose your spot in the registration line.
- Register all children from the household prior to checking out/ submitting your registration.
- Transfer fees will apply to transfer any camp or other program dates.

## To Streamline Camp Program Registration

- Health and medical information will not be collected at the time of registration.
- •Please enter the name of the parent/ legal guardian (who has permanent legal guardianship, as it relates to health and legal decisions) as they will be required to complete the health-related information on the CampDoc parent portal system at a later date.

Failure to complete this information could result in your camper not being able to attend camp.

# Online Registration Confirmation

You will receive a registration report by email as a confirmation of your online registration. Please read the following information:

- Confirmed program dates and times.
- Special notes.
- Waiting list information if program sessions you selected were sold out.
- Additional follow-up that may be required.

#### Wait List

For any camp/program choices that sell out, you can sign up to be on the wait list(s) while registering online.

A payment is not required for the wait list. We will notify you if an opening occurs, and if you accept, payment will be required at that time. If you choose to decline an opening, you will be removed from that wait list.

#### **Cancellations and Refunds**

Advanced notice is required for all cancellations/refund requests. Please notify the Education Department as soon as possible at (314) 646-4544, option #6. Cancellation fees apply as follows:

- Required three weeks' notice and a \$25 fee to cancel Camp Joey, Camp KangaZoo, Teen Camp and Specialty Camps
- •Required two weeks' notice and an \$8 fee to cancel all other programs
- Less than two weeks' notice no refund will be issued

Participants may not make up or receive a refund for missed programs.



Transfers are subject to availability. Please notify the Education Department as soon as possible if you need to transfer. Transfer fees apply and are due at the time of your request.

- Required three weeks' notice and a \$25 fee to transfer Camp Joey, Camp KangaZoo, Teen Camp and Specialty Camps
- •Required two weeks' notice and an \$8 fee to transfer all other programs

# Important COVID-19 Information

To prevent the spread of COVID-19, additional restrictions may be required for attending all in-person programs. Changes to this policy will be updated as needed.



#### **Inclusion Statement**

We know that children of all abilities benefit when they play and learn together, and it is our goal that whenever possible they do so in our conservation education programs. Each individual program will determine the level of support needed for participation. Inclusion facilitators are available for intermittent support at our camp programs. However, if 1:1 support is required at school or in a public setting like the Zoo – where elopement risks are increased, and a 1:5 ratio is not sufficient for support and safety - we ask that families provide an aide with a verified background check.

Our goal is that every child has the opportunity to enjoy our programs with the appropriate supports needed for success. Our programs are developmentally appropriate for the set age range listed. We realize that sometimes developmental level does not correlate to chronological age. If this is the case, please reach out to us to determine the best placement for your child. # Medication Authorization Policy

For parents/adults registered to attend in-person programs with their child: If your child needs to take medication during any in-person Zoo program, you are responsible for carrying the medication and monitoring your child's needs.

For parents of youth attending programs unaccompanied by an adult:

If your child needs to take medication during Zoo program hours (including insulin or an insulin pump), you must complete the Zoo's Medication Authorization Form. Emergency rescue medicine, including an EpiPen or other epinephrine auto-injector, requires completing the FARE - Food Allergy and Anaphylaxis Emergency Care Plan. Complete medication information is required before your child attends their Zoo program.

For camp programs, health and medical information will not be collected at the time of registration, but it will be required to be entered by the parent/legal guardian in the CampDoc parent portal system at a later date.

### **Parking For Programs**

Parking is available on the Zoo's North Lot on Government Drive and the South Lot on Wells Drive for a fee. Zoo members can use their free parking benefits. Limited free street parking is available. Visit **stlzoo.org** for parking details and pricing.

Congestion on streets in Forest Park can cause a delay in your arrival time. Please plan extra time so that you arrive on time for any in-person Zoo program.

### **Zoo Policy**

Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult at all times on Zoo grounds. Parents of children under the age of 14: please plan to escort your child to class and then pick them up when their program is over. You will be asked to sign your child "in" and "out" before and after programs. All program participants will be accompanied by Zoo staff and/or Zoo volunteers during their program.





## **Camp Program Information**

The Saint Louis Zoo takes great pride in its camp tradition. Zoo camp programs are designed using best practices in environmental education, are developmentally appropriate and fun, and are led by trained educators. These camps are, however, not a part of a school program and therefore not licensed by the state department of elementary and secondary education.

Children attend these programs without their parent or caregiver. Zoo educators and volunteers facilitate these programs. To accommodate as many children as possible, you can only register for one session of each camp topic.

#### **Camp Inclusion Needs**

We welcome all campers and can discuss any unique circumstances prior to your camp session in order to assess how to best support your needs. ### Science Safety Contract

Some camp programs may include dissection or other lab activities, which will require parental or guardian consent to our Science Safety Contract at the time of registration.
